Michael J. Boyle, PhD • Keynote Speaker

Michael J. Boyle is the Assistant Director of the Andrew M. Greeley Center for Catholic Education at Loyola University Chicago. Dr. Boyle has worked in education in a variety of settings and roles. As a school psychologist at both the high school and elementary levels, he worked with students across a broad range of areas of exceptionality. He has also served as a special education administrator in several public school districts. Additionally, Dr. Boyle also served as principal in a large Catholic elementary school. Dr. Boyle was recently named the 2014 recipient of the C. Albert Koob Merit Award from the National Catholic Education Association for significant contributions to Catholic education.

Dr. Boyle has provided professional development programs to a number of Catholic schools and across the country in the areas of multi-tiered systems of support differentiation, school-based problem solving teams, and leadership development. Within the School of Education, Dr. Boyle teaches courses in multi-tiered systems of support, mission-driven leadership and ethics.



Torrie Dunlap, CPLP • Keynote Speaker

In 1998, Torrie Dunlap found her life's purpose when she taught a theater class for children that included a boy with Down syndrome. It was Kids Included Together that helped her create a successful theater experience for this student, and in the process changed her worldview. She became a KIT volunteer, then a board member, and in 2003 joined the staff as a part-time Program Coordinator. She later served as the Executive Director of KIT's National Training Center on Inclusion, and in 2012 become KIT's Chief Executive Officer.

Torrie has delivered keynotes and trainings on inclusion around the United States and in Europe, and she has been published in textbooks, professional journals, trade magazines, and in digital media. She is a regular contributor to the advocacy website "Think Inclusive," the SWIFT schools blog "SWIFTtalk," and was a frequent guest host on the podcast "The Inclusive Class." Torrie is a Certified Professional in Learning and Performance, and in 2013 was selected as a Social Innovation Fellow at Stanford's Graduate School of Business. Dr. Christine Bonfiglio is the Director, Program for Inclusive Education, Director of the Office of Professional Standards and a faculty member with the ACE Teaching Fellows program at the University of Notre Dame. She taught in the ACE Teaching Exceptional Children program for three years and has also served as the Department Chair and Director of Special Education for the Teacher Education Department at Goshen College. Prior to her work in higher education, Bonfiglio worked in the public schools as a school psychologist, evaluating students, collaborating with teachers regarding academic and behavioral needs, and facilitating the child study team. She received her Ph.D. in Educational Psychology from Western Michigan University, specializing in Applied Behavior Analysis and academic interventions.
